Testing Administrator Training

Per state policy, all program staff who administer adult education assessments must complete test administrator training as required by the test publisher.

Test Administrator Training Resources:

- TABE 11/12 (for ABE) test administrator training is available <u>online</u>. Certification candidates must complete <u>training module one</u> and <u>training module two</u> in their entirety for the certificate to be generated. The password for both parts is "tabecertdrc."
- **TABE CLAS-E (for ELA) test administrator training** is completed via a DVD/Workbook that may be ordered from <u>TABE</u> along with testing materials.
- BEST Literacy 2.0 (for ELA) new assessor training & BEST Plus 3.0 is a full-day virtual training. Note that current BEST administrators are required to attend recalibration training every two years. This training is provided via a self-paced Canvas course. Program directors should contact <u>Danielle Pedersen</u> to schedule new assessor training or add staff to the recalibration course as needed.
- CASAS training (for programs that have selected the GOALS series for ABE and/or the STEPS series for ELA) is available <u>online</u>. The eTest modules 1 and 2 can be found under the <u>CASAS eTest Implementation</u> and the paper test modules 1 and 3 can be found under the <u>CASAS Paper Test Implementation</u>.

The mission of the <u>Adult Education Association of Utah (AEAUT)</u>, as the primary advocate for lifelong learning, is to meet the diverse needs of all Utahns by providing and supporting quality education opportunities.

Adult Education Canvas Instance

Utah Adult Education has a Canvas instance, allowing all adult educators access to create and share courses. Each program director has admin rights and can add staff. For assistance with Canvas, contact <u>Alex Ellerman</u>. Professional Learning Courses are available on Canvas below. Contact your program directors or USBE technical assistant to be added:

- NRS 101 (Required Annual Training): This Canvas course provides an overview of
 the National Reporting System (NRS) for Adult Education. All adult education staff
 must complete training annually. Staff that have Canvas accounts can self-enroll
 using this link.. For new staff members needing account creation or password help,
 contact Alex Ellerman.
- Adult Education New Teacher Academy: This self-paced Canvas course is used for onboarding new staff to adult education. Topics include an overview of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), adult learner theory, career pathways, the College and Career Readiness Standards (CCRS), and the English Language Proficiency Standards (ELPS) for Adult Education.
- **GED Basics 101:** This course will help adult education personnel become familiar with eligibility for taking the GED® test, the basic features of the GED® test and what accommodations are available, how to use the GED Ready® test to help students prepare, and how to score the extended response question. Anyone helping students prepare for the GED® test should complete this course.
- **Growing With Canvas:** This free course available in the <u>Canvas Commons</u> has five modules of content that will take users through everything they need to know about using Canvas at their institutions. The course uses a combination of Canvas Video Guides and Canvas Guides to teach the content. Participants can try out several concepts through the practice assignments.

UEN Canvas Foundations

In this asynchronous course, participants will learn to design and deliver an online course using Canvas. This course will guide participants in creating their own course using best practices to set up a visual home page, add engaging content, assess student learning, and communicate effectively using Canvas. The focus of this course is to learn about pedagogical practices with online course design by using the features within Canvas to create a course that will benefit both the teacher and students.

Essential Education Courses

Utah Adult Education provides three Essential Education online professional learning courses: *Identifying and Remediating Reading Skill Difficulties, Motivating the Adult Learner*, and *Blended Learning in Adult Education*. Each teacher can view their progress, participation time, and lesson mastery in easy-to-read charts located on their learning dashboard. Teachers can self-enroll in courses here. Those who complete all three courses and complete a reflection paper may earn 1.0 USBE credit towards re-licensure. For assistance or a credit request form, contact Danielle Pedersen.
